WEEKLY FOCUS: CROATIA

After living in Croatia for more than 22 years, missionary Eric Maroney has witnessed the reluctance of people to believe the truth of the Gospel and has endured the skepticism toward evangelical churches. In a country with only 7,000 evangelicals, there are now more than 40,000 people listening to radio broadcasts of sermons, spiritual songs, interviews with believers, and questions from callers. Eric and his ministry team trust that the "broad seed sowing" of the broadcasts touches people's hearts and offers an alternative for those living without the hope of Christ.

PRAYER FOCUS:

Pray for the local church in Croatia as they host evangelistic events, concerts, English as a second language classes, and summer camps to spread the gospel and connect seekers with local congregations. Many desert tribes are gaining access to the internet via smartphones. Through the internet, efforts are being made to sow the Word broadly among the Mediterranean coastal tribes, including the Bedouin of Northern Africa. Pray this would give unreached peoples first-time access to God's Word. Many contacts are being made online during lockdowns. Those who would normally never visit a church in person are taking part in online gospel dialogues, worship services, and Bible studies. Pray for creative ways to share more about the gospel. Pray the uncertainty and chaos of the pandemic would bring people closer to the Lord. Ask God to send more Christian communicators into this online harvest field.
