# "THE POWER OF INVITATION" LUKE 14:16-24

If you're like many people in our church, you don't want to just sit there. You want to *do something*, making an impact through your faith. But what can you do? Especially during COVID-19, you may feel limited. Still, you know deep down, "I can't just keep sitting here. I was made for more."

There's something that only you can do, but there is also something that all of us must do. To make an eternal difference, you must join God in giving the great invitation to others. You have been invited into the kingdom. Now you must extend the invitation to others. One day you'll be asked, "What did you do with what I gave to you?" But as you're welcomed to the great banquet, you'll also be asked, "Whom did you bring along with you?"

We can't just sit there. We must *all* extend God's great invitation. How do we "do" this?

The prompt of the parable: "When one of those at the table with Him heard this, he said to Jesus, 'Blessed is the one who will eat at the feast of the Kingdom of God' (Luke 14:15, NIV)."
