"A TIME FOR SHAKING"

ACTS 4:23-31

The pandemic has shaken our world. Our economic world, work lives, public health, social relationships, emotional stability, and mental health have been shaken. Apart from the pandemic, we all have things that shake us to our core. Maybe an illness comes on us unexpectedly. The death of a loved one can come suddenly, or the loss of a job. Suddenly, all the stability we were used to is no longer there. It's easy to get discouraged and wonder why these things happen and whether things will ever return to normal.

Sometimes God allows us to be shaken in order to	us
for a better future.	

In Acts 4, the church was being shaken. The threats of violence towards the believers were real. So what did they do? The Bible says that Peter and John went straight to the church and told them what was happening. They gathered together and prayed together. The Holy Spirit shook the place where they were meeting. They went out filled with power to preach the word of God with boldness.

"...'My Spirit is abiding in your midst; do not fear!' For thus says the Lord of hosts, 'Once more in a little while, *I am going to shake the heavens and the earth*, the sea also and the dry land. I will shake all the nations; and they will come with the wealth of all nations, and I will fill this house with glory,' says the Lord of hosts." (Haggai 2:5-7, NASB)

Here are three questions to call us to faithfulness in this moment of disruption and change.

The first question: Will we	together when th

Family Promise: Night Without A Bed


Saturday, June 26
