SERMONNOTES

"UNITY: IT'S WHAT THE TRINITY WANTS" GENESIS 1:26-27

God loves it when the church is unified. God blesses a unified church. The church is filled with people from different personalities and backgrounds and races and preferences, but for the sake of unity, we can't let our differences divide us.

It's your job to protect the unity of the church.

Our influence in the world is directly tied to the unity we display.

Dancing is mentioned in the Old and New Testaments as a way to praise God. Ecclesiastes says that there is a time to mourn and a time to dance. Psalm 149 says that God's people should praise His name with dancing and make music with the timbrel and harp "for the Lord takes delight in his people." God says that dancing is a right response to God's delight in God's people. But have you considered that the very nature of God is like a dance?

"In the beginning was the Word [Jesus], and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning. Through Him all things were made; without Him nothing was made that has been made." (John 1:1-3, NIV)

"Then God said, 'Let us make human beings in our image, to be like us..." (Genesis 1:26, NLT)

"There are six things the LORD hatesa person who stirs up conflict in the community." (Proverbs 6:16,19, NIV)

Mask Policy Update on the Children and Preschool Floors

We appreciate your patience and compliance as we have continued to require masks for adults and children in these two areas. Our decisions have not been made lightly, as we have always tried to keep the safety of everyone in mind. Based on current Knox County COVID-19 cases, the numbers continue to remain extremely low (on 6/23 there were 1.28 new cases per 100,000 residents; positivity testing results below 3%; 0 deaths since 6/18).

With VBS and Worship Arts Camp coming up, we have re-examined our policy and made the following changes:

- Beginning Sunday, July 11, masks will no longer be required on these two floors. They are optional for anyone still desiring to wear one. Our teachers have been vaccinated but will make that choice for themselves.
- Masks will be optional for both VBS and Worship Arts Camp but not required.

Again, this decision comes with great prayer and discussion. With most of the children returning to school less than a month after these two events with no mask requirements, we believe the time is right to adjust our policy.


We Need Your Help
