# THE CHURCH COUNCIL

ur church's mission is to fulfill the Great Commission (to make disciples among all nations; see Matthew 28:19-20) while living out the Great Commandment (loving God with all of our heart, mind, soul, and strength, and loving neighbors as ourselves; see Matthew 22:36-40). In order to fulfill our mission, we organize in ways that reflect Biblical principles. In addition to having deacons and hired staff, our church also coordinates ministries and makes major decisions through a Church Council. This is a new structure for First Baptist. According to our bylaws, "The Church Council shall serve as the Church's policy and major decision-making and oversight body and is accountable to the Congregation." It consists of the chairpersons of administrative committees (like Personnel or Finance), ministry councils (like Discipleship or Missions), as well as the chairperson of the deacon body.

The vice-chairpersons of all of those groups also attend Church Council for the purposes of accountability and continuity but do not vote. The Senior Pastor and ministerial staff also attend and provide input but have no vote.

The Church Council meets monthly on the second Thursday of each month. The group reviews our church calendar, hears reports from councils and committees and deacons, asks for input from ministerial staff, and discusses and votes on items that are deemed not to require congregational approval. They also can discuss and vote on items that ultimately will be sent to the congregation for a final vote.

The Church Council serves as a kind of communication hub, coordinating ministries. The group also approves long-range plans and discusses other matters as laid out in our bylaws. Any member of our congregation can address the Council by requesting to be added to the agenda before the meeting. It could be said that the Church Council provides organizational leadership to the church, while the deacons, pastor, and ministerial staff provide spiritual leadership to the church. Please pray today for the Church Council, especially Chairperson Josh Durham. Pray for wise, Spirit-filled decisions and a strong sense of unity as we fulfill the Great Commission and Great Commandment together.

# **SERMON**NOTES

# "PRAYING AND LIVING LUKE 10:2" LUKE 10:1-9

In Luke 10, we see Jesus was passing the baton to His disciples, releasing them to do what He did, and preparing them for life when He would only be present through the Holy Spirit. We can imagine the excitement and energy as the disciples heard the words "Go!" There was a sense of urgency that marked their mission. Why?

"The harvest is *plentiful...*" (Luke 10:2a, NIV)

There isn't just a labor shortage in America. There's one in the church as well. The church needs a fresh wind and fresh fire of the Spirit to see the abundant harvest before us — in places where we live, work, and play. We must accept the call of God to go across the street, across town, or around the world to share the good news of Jesus.

Our most urgent need is to \_\_\_\_\_\_ the vision of the harvest.

"When he saw the crowds, *he had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless*, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, 'The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few....'" (Matthew 9:36-37, NIV)

Recapture the vision, pray, and go!

"*For Christ's love compels us*, because we are convinced that one died for all, and therefore all died. And he died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for him who died for them and was raised again." (2 Corinthians 5:14-15, NIV)

Some practical ways you can pray and live Luke 10:2:

1. Invite a friend or a family to Friends Sunday, August 15th.

2. Set a reminder on your watch or phone to specifically pray for workers to be raised up to work in God's fields.

3. Make the decision to step out and be baptized, committing your life to serving the Lord. Mark your calendar for the afternoon of August 29th for a special outdoor baptism at the lake. Invite your friends to be part of this celebration.

4. Look for people of peace in your neighborhood as you seek to spread God's love close to home.
