magine for a moment that you have never been to First Baptist Church and are looking for a church to visit. You don't know anyone and the facility is large with two buildings and a parking garage. How do you know where to go? Where do you go in? Where do you park when so many spaces say "reserved?" These are some of the questions that someone might ask if they are visiting First Baptist for the first time. If we are the warm and welcoming church we want to be, we want to put in place people to make sure anyone who comes will find a friendly face and a willing person to show them the way. It is more than just saying, "Hello" and "Welcome to First Baptist Church." That is what the Connection Team is all about.

Our goal is to help people be connected to First Baptist from the first time they visit us. When we don't, they may not come back. We want to make their visit as warm and friendly as we can so that they feel loved and readily part of the fellowship. We need many volunteers to serve as: Parking Lot/Garage Greeters, Welcome Center and Trentham Hall Greeters, Information Desk Volunteers, and Runners who will take a person to their destination instead of just giving directions. All of these things say to someone that we care about them and want them to come back. It is being a "Good Neighbor."

We have some volunteers but not nearly enough to cover every time slot in every location. There are four time slots to volunteer: 8:15-8:55 am, 9:15-10 am, 10:30-11:10 am, and Noon -12:15 pm. Would you volunteer for one of these slots in one of these positions once a month? We have had some to volunteer, but we need more people to make it work well.

This is a wonderful way for you to serve in our church and, more importantly, be that person to make someone feel at home. Please consider being part of this important Connection Team, and let me know where and when you would like to greet the people that God sends our way for His church.
