SERMONNOTES

"HOW TO SLEEP ON A STORMY NIGHT" MATTHEW 7:24-27

Do you want more peace and security for the future? Do you want a life that lasts with a solid purpose? Jesus concludes the Sermon on the Mount with a simple story. It's about how one approaches life and the kind of life one builds day by day. When the storm comes, the foundation of the house makes all the difference. You could call this parable, "Life and how to build it."

Jesus is saying, "If you want a life that is secure; if you want a life that stands up in the storm; if you want a future that isn't blown away by the ups and downs and tragic circumstances of the human condition," then this is how to build your life.

There are four simple elements in Jesus' parable.
