"FLY LIKE AN EAGLE"

PSALM 103:1-5

God made you with a unique soul and a purpose. The Bible says in 2 Timothy 1:9 that by His power, God saved all of us and then called us to a holy work. You didn't have anything to do with it. It was all God's idea. And as you fulfill your purpose with the Spirit of God flowing through you, your spirit was created to soar like an eagle. You weren't made to live scratching around like chickens, competing, looking for little scraps, and pecking at one another.

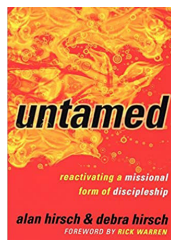
