"I AM THE DOOR"

JOHN 10:7-10

Today's message focuses on Jesus' teaching about how He came to bring abundant life, but the "thief" comes to steal, kill, and destroy. It may be today that as you peer into the storage shed of your heart, you would say, "Something has been lost. I don't know how long it has been gone, but something has been taken from me."

Many Christians have had their joy stolen. Some of you have had their peace or "spiritual pep" stolen by the enemy.

"Jesus [said] ... 'I came so they can have real and eternal life, more and better life than they ever dreamed of.'" (John 10:10 The Message)

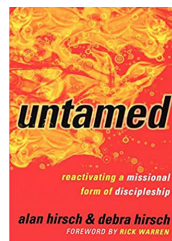
