SERMONNOTES

"WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO TAKE UP YOUR CROSS?"

LUKE 9:23-25

For the last few weeks, we have focused in worship around the idea of what we do and why we do it. Two weeks ago, we studied the parable of the lost sheep and how we were *made for mission*. Last week we considered how we are *called to community* as we thought about the meaning of being "clothed" in Christ. Today we are thinking about discipleship and how we have been *created to become like Christ*. That's the heart of discipleship.

"The Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests and the teachers of the law, and he must be killed and on the third day be raised to life." (Luke 9:22, NIV)

What does it mean when Jesus says we are called to take up the cross, too? Let's consider three crosses:
