Prayer That Moves Mountains

Resist the Roaring Lion

1 Peter 5:6-11

Dr. Brent McDougal

George Müller's principles for prayer that moves mountains:

- a) Abide in Christ daily (depend on Him for everything)
- b) Pray in accordance with the will of God
- c) Forsake sin
- d) Exercise faith
- e) Persevere in prayer

Today we're dealing with the third principle: how to deal with temptation and sin.

If there's known sin in your life, it impacts the power of your prayers. What happens when you're not praying impacts what happens when you do pray. Pursuing mindless activities, bad habits, negative thoughts, failing to forgive — all of these diminish the power of prayer.

But what if there was a way to overcome temptation and not get snagged up, so that you and I could see more and more answers to prayer?

Peter knew what it was like to fall. That's why he speaks with such credibility in chapter 5 of his first letter (1 Peter).

*“Pride goes before destruction, a haughty spirit before a fall”
(Proverbs 16:18, NIV).*

SERMONNOTES

Four urgings from Peter to overcome temptation and sin:

1. Allow yourself to be _____ under the Lord's hand.

“Search me, God, and know my heart; test me and know my anxious thoughts. See if there is any offensive way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting” (Psalm 139:23-24, NIV).

2. Bring every _____ thought before the Lord.

“Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.” (Philippians 4:6-7, NIV).

3. Be _____ and self-controlled.

“Be on your guard; stand firm in the faith; be courageous; be strong. Do everything in love” (1 Corinthians 16:13-14, NIV).

4. Resist the _____ lion.

“Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you” (James 4:7, ESV).

What is God saying to you today? Make a commitment as you listen to the voice of the Holy Spirit.

SPOTLIGHT ON

LEADERS SUMMIT

On Saturday, January 8th, about 30 leaders from our church met for the morning (in-person and virtually) to talk about the future. This group included our current Church Council, Church Trustees, Endowment Trustees, Monday Fund Trustees, and a few others. After some discussion of our mission (The Great Commandment to make disciples, lived out through the Great Commandment to love God and neighbor), we reviewed current challenges such as the pandemic's impact, the need to rebuild our fellowship, renovation/repair requirements, and a desire to ignite passion for the hurting and the lost. Then we heard reports about current projects and aspirational goals to lead us into the next two to three years. Our goal was to create a priority list of ministry and mission objectives to guide us through 2024.

Many of the priorities that rose to the top include: correction of moisture problems, bathrooms renovation, children's floor renovation, development of the Care First ministry center on campus as well as a East Knoxville ministry location, worship leadership that involves a mix of generations, exterior cleaning, interior signage, and the creation of a church app and fbcknox.tv (as well as many other important goals). We also touched on the possibility of a larger building effort to work on our lower parking lot and improve our Neyland Drive frontage.

Our next step is to work through the Long Range Planning Committee to develop a comprehensive list of these projects and task the Finance Committee to recommend how funding for these projects will be coordinated.

There was a great spirit of unity and hopefulness among the participants. We are blessed with a talented, committed group of leaders, and we thank them for giving a morning to discern our church's direction through the Holy Spirit. Please pray for the future of our congregation. God is leading us into a bright, impactful future for God's kingdom.
