Children's Sermon | Susan Tatum

Scripture Reading (Exodus 17: 1-13) | Pam Neal

The whole Israelite community set out from the Desert of Sin, traveling from place to place as the Lord commanded. They camped at Rephidim, but there was no water for the people to drink. 2 So they quarreled with Moses and said, "Give us water to drink."

Moses replied, "Why do you quarrel with me? Why do you put the Lord to the test?"

- 3 But the people were thirsty for water there, and they grumbled against Moses. They said, "Why did you bring us up out of Egypt to make us and our children and livestock die of thirst?"
- 4 Then Moses cried out to the Lord, "What am I to do with these people? They are almost ready to stone me."
- 5 The Lord answered Moses, "Go out in front of the people. Take with you some of the elders of Israel and take in your hand the staff with which you struck the Nile, and go. 6 I will stand there before you by the rock at Horeb. Strike the rock, and water will come out of it for the people to drink." So Moses did this in the sight of the elders of Israel. 7 And he called the place Massah and Meribah because the Israelites quarreled and because they tested the Lord saying, "Is the Lord among us or not?"
- 8 The Amalekites came and attacked the Israelites at Rephidim. 9 Moses said to Joshua, 'Choose some of our men and go out to fight the Amalekites. Tomorrow I will stand on top of the hill with the staff of God in my hands.'

10 So Joshua fought the Amalekites as Moses had ordered, and Moses, Aaron and Hur went to the top of the hill. 11 As long as Moses held up his hands, the Israelites were winning, but whenever he lowered his hands, the Amalekites were winning. 12 When Moses' hands grew tired, they took a stone and put it under him and he sat on it. Aaron and Hur held his hands up – one on one side, one on the other – so that his hands remained steady till sunset. 13 So Joshua overcame the Amalekite army with the sword

Never Give Up! Exodus 17: 1-13 Dr. Brent McDougal

Life can feel like a winding staircase. Splinters that cut the skin. Hazardous steps. And we've probably all been on a dark stairwell where the shadows seem to have danger lurking. And just about all of us have been tempted to give up. Why keep trying? Why keep praying? I don't see any answer. I don't see any difference.

"Jesus told his disciples a parable to show them that they should always pray and not give up" (Luke 18:1, NIV).
Moses never gave up. He may have been discouraged sometimes, but he never stopped looking to God for help.
Whatever battle you're facing, God wants you to always pray and never give up.
Never give up, because
1. God blesses those who
"Blessed is the one who perseveres under trial because, having stood the test, that person will receive the crown of life that the Lord has promised to those who love him" (James 1:12, NIV).
2. God makes small on big prayers.
"Now He who has made us and prepared us for this very purpose is God, who gave us the [Holy] Spirit as a pledge [a guarantee, a down payment on the fulfillment of His promise]" (2 Corinthians 5:5, AMP).

3. God gives _


