SERMON NOTES

The Great Adventure
Mark 1:16-20
Pastor Brent McDougal

Too many Christians live without a sense of purpose. There's no adventure. As B.B. King sang, "The thrill is gone."

"Come, follow me,' Jesus said, 'and I will send you out to fish for people.' At once they left their nets and followed Him...without delay He called them, and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired men and followed Him" (Mark 1:17-18, 20, NIV).

Zebedee chose to stay. We don't know the reasons why, but we do know that he missed out on an incredible adventure.

Let's explore God's calling on your life.

1. Each person has a _____ calling from God.

"For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them"
(Ephesians 2:10, ESV).

2. To know or _____ your calling, seek to know the One who calls you.

"They said to Him, 'What must we do to do the works God requires?' Jesus answered, 'The work of God is this: to believe in the one He has sent'"
(John 6:28-29, NIV).

3. Your calling will always push you out of your _____ zone.

*“For I know the plans I have for you,” declares the LORD, “plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future”
(Jeremiah 29:11, NIV).*

“Since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before him he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God” (Hebrews 12:1-2, NIV).

4. God’s calling requires a _____.

First Baptist serves with Appalachian Ministries of the Smokies



This summer, AMOS (formally known as Appalachian Outreach) will host home repair teams from all over the Southeast to complete 19 home repair projects in Jefferson County and surrounding counties. First Baptist was privi-

leged to be one of the first groups of the summer. Our team built a deck, ramp, fence, fixed a roof, and built a door for a homeowner in Strawberry Plains.

The home repair ministry is only a part of the work of AMOS. Located in Jefferson City, Tennessee, AMOS serves those on the margins of society throughout the year by providing a food and clothing pantry, emergency shelter for women and children in crisis, and a thrift store.

Over the past 37 years, AMOS has completed over 1,000 home repair projects, served more than 1,500 families experiencing crisis, and has provided more than 150,000 boxes of food to those in need.
