In those days when the number of disciples was increasing, the Hellenistic Jews among them complained against the Hebraic Jews because their widows were being overlooked in the daily distribution of food. 2 So the Twelve gathered all the disciples together and said, "It would not be right for us to neglect the ministry of the word of God in order to wait on tables. 3 Brothers and sisters, choose seven men from among you who are known to be full of the Spirit and wisdom. We will turn this responsibility over to them 4 and will give our attention to prayer and the ministry of the word."

5 This proposal pleased the whole group. They chose Stephen, a man full of

faith and of the Holy Spirit; also Philip, Procorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicolas from Antioch, a convert to Judaism. 6 They presented these men to the apostles, who prayed and laid their hands on them.

7 So the word of God spread. The number of disciples in Jerusalem increased rapidly, and a large number of priests became obedient to the faith.

SERMONNOTES

Is God Great? Psalm 8 Pastor Brent McDougal

As children, many of us learned the prayer, "God is great, God is good. Let us thank him for our food." We sing hymns about God's greatness such as "How Great Thou Art" and modern songs like Chris Tomlin's "How Great is Our God." Scriptures declare over and over the greatness of God.

"Great is the Lord, and greatly to be praised, and his greatness is unsearchable" (Psalm 145:3, ESV).

"Yours, Lord, is the greatness and the power and the glory and the majesty and the splendor, for everything in heaven and earth is yours" (1 Chronicles 29:11, NIV).

But even people of faith can wonder sometimes, "Is God really great? What about when trouble comes? What about times when circumstances seem overwhelming?"

In moments like that, King David looked up. Here's what we can learn
from what David wrote in Psalm 8 about the greatness of God.

Civil Rights Pilgrimage to Alabama

August 4-6

Join Pastors Brent McDougal and Tim Boone for a three-day journey to explore some of the most significant civil rights sites in Alabama.

After departing early Thursday morning, our group will tour the Civil Rights Institute, Kelly Ingram Park, and 16th Street Baptist Church in Birmingham, then head to Montgomery to see the Legacy Museum, National Memorial for Peace and Justice, and the Rosa Parks Museum. Finally, we will spend some time at the Edmund Pettus Bridge in

Selma where "Bloody Sunday" took place and tour the Lowndes Interpretive Center to learn about the Selma

to Montgomery march before returning late afternoon on Saturday. The cost is \$160 per person double occupancy, \$270 per person single occupancy, plus six meals (scholarships available).
