My Sheep Hear My Voice John 10:11-16, 27-28 Pastor Brent McDougal

Of all the voices we hear in a day, none is more critical to how we live our lives than the voice of Jesus. But not every one recognizes His voice and even people who believe in Him struggle to hear His voice some- times. So today's message answers three questions:
Who hears His voice?
