
If you can use a hammer, saw, glue gun, paint brush, stapler, ladder, or have some experience in set design, please let Susan know.

Southwest Virginia Children's Choir

The Southwest Virginia Children's Choir was established in 2003 by Mrs. Wrenda Fuller, now-retired music educator from Russell County, Virginia and Dr. Joseph Trivette, Chair of the Music Program at Southwest Virginia Community College who serves as its conductor. The Children's Choir performs each December as "The Singing Christmas Tree" and each spring in a clinic and concert with internationally-acclaimed guest conductors, who have included Dr. Andre Thomas and Dr. Rollo Dilworth, or travels to perform throughout the southeast region of the United States.



The SWVA Children's Choir was chosen to perform at the Virginia Music Educators' Association Conference in 2005 and 2013. In the spring of 2012, they sang the National Anthems of the U.S. and Canada at an Atlanta Braves baseball game. They have performed at Stars of Southwest Virginia, the Durham Children's Choir Festival, and twice at Duke University Chapel as guest musicians. Recent performances include Covenant Presbyterian in Charlotte, NC; First Presbyterian in Norfolk, VA; Dollywood; and aboard the Battleship Wisconsin in 2018.

Joseph Trivette

Director Joseph Trivette is the Albert Endowed Chair of Music at Southwest Virginia Community College. Trivette holds a Ph.D. in Music Education through Florida State University, a Bachelor's in Music Education and Performance and Master's in Piano Performance from Appalachian State University.

Trivette directs the SWCC Community Chorus, the SWCC Jazz Vocal Ensemble, The Wells Fargo Honors Jazz Band and is in high demand as a collaborative pianist and clinician in addition to his teaching load and direction of the Children's Chorus.
