

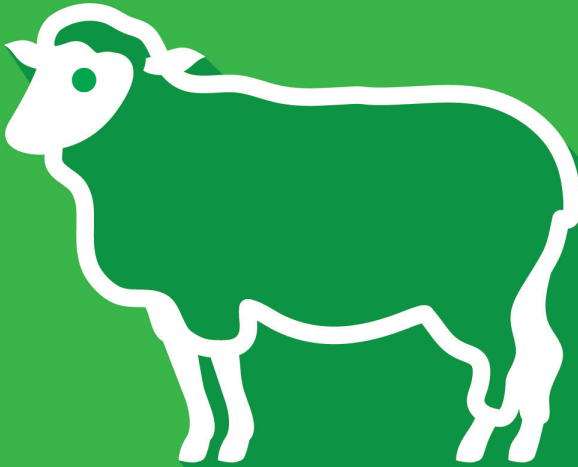

SERMONNOTES

Lost and Found
Luke 15:1-7
Pastor Brent McDougal

Jesus often used parables, or stories, to teach His listeners a lesson. Parables are about everyday things, like a farmer who sows seeds or a merchant looking for a pearl, but these simple stories carry big truths. In the 15th chapter of Luke, Jesus tells a parable about a lost sheep.

But why did He tell this story?

“Behold, the Lord God comes with might, and his arm rules for him...He will tend his flock like a shepherd; he will gather the lambs in his arms; he will carry them in his bosom, and gently lead those that are with young”
(Isaiah 40:10-11, ESV).

“Know that the LORD is God. It is he who made us, and we are his; we are his people, the sheep of his pasture” (Psalm 100:3, NIV).

The central question that can't be avoided is: Do you _____?

Here are four big lessons from this brief parable:

1. Every _____ matters to God.

“God loved the world so much that He gave his one and only Son so that whoever believes in Him may not be lost, but have eternal life”
(John 3:16, NCV).

The Generations Campaign

FBC's Fall Capital Effort
October 16-November 13

The Generations Campaign is centered around efforts to raise \$3 Million to renovate areas which represent places of education, worship and fellowship for the children and youth of First Baptist Church Knoxville and our community. The bulk of the campaign (\$2 Million) will involve renovating the second floor of the Education building (1st-5th grades) to allow for a major change in design, lighting, technology, and security. The remaining funds (\$1 Million) will be used for updating the first floor of the Education building (Babies/Preschool-K) with finishes, lighting, and security features, improving the Youth Suite, and updating bathrooms and hallways that function as our main hospitality areas for guests in worship.

We believe that this renovation is mission critical in making disciples for generations to come. More information will be shared in the coming weeks, but today we are commissioning The Generations Campaign Steering Team:
