When You Walk Through the Fire Genesis 39:1-6a Pastor Brent McDougal

Joseph had been given a great dream. On the way to that dream's fulfillment, however, he faced many trials and much adversity. What kept him going and how was he able to continue to be successful?

"The Lord was with Joseph so that he prospered, and he lived in the house of his Egyptian master. When his master saw that the Lord was with him and that the Lord gave him success in everything he did, Joseph found favor in his eyes..." (Genesis 39:2-4, NIV).

All of us face trials and trouble. But if we continue to believe that anything is possible with God, and that God is near to us, then God can accomplish great things through us, too.

What does this story teach us about moving through trials?

1. Refuse to be ______.

"See to it that no one falls short of the grace of God and that no bitter root grows up to cause trouble and defile many" (Hebrews 12:15, NIV).

"I came naked from my mother's womb," [Job] said, 'and I shall have nothing when I die. The Lord gave me everything I had, and they were his to take away. Blessed be the name of the Lord." In all of this Job did not sin or revile God" (Job 1:21-22 TLB).

2. Expect God to ______ all that God allows.

3. Count on His _____.
