Downtown Lenten Lunch and Worship Series

Mission trip to Uganda

October 8-16

Missy Ward and Francis Angalla will host a team from First Baptist later this year. The trip will focus on cultural education and ministry with refugees. Cultural education emphasis: You will learn about Ugandan culture by shopping at local markets, learning how to make traditional baskets, and participating in other cultural experiences. Ministry with refugees: You will support various Amani Sasa ministries by encouraging volunteers, introducing recipes from Tennessee, and working with Refuge in Hope. Cost for the trip is \$1,500 (scholarships are available for young adults). This includes airfare, lodging, and transportation. There will be an optional two-day safari at the end of the trip for an additional cost of \$600. Only 6 spots remaining! Final day to sign-up is June 24th (\$750 deposit due).
