

Think of all that has happened in the last two years. The pandemic has caused so much pain, disruption, sadness, anger, and uncertainty. It has felt like a wilderness.	"His divine power has given us everything we need for a godly life through our knowledge of him who called us by his own glory and goodness" (2 Peter 1:3, NIV).
But strange things happen in the wilderness. Moses saw the burning bush in the wilderness and heard the call to work to liberate the Hebrews. The people then wandered through the desert eating quail and manna for 40 years. David fled to the wilderness when Saul tried to kill him.	"Seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well" (Matthew 6:33, NIV).

# Coffee and Conversation Ministry Brews Care and Relationships

Every Thursday for the past few months, a team of dedicated volunteers have offered a free coffee, tea, and hot chocolate service to people in the downtown area. The idea was birthed from the recognition that several hundred people pass by our church building each day. We wanted to find a way to bless people, start conversations, and learn how we can care well for the people who live, work, or visit downtown.

Our volunteers have been trained to brew specialty coffee drinks such as lattes and cappuccinos to offer a very nice coffee service for our guests. In the past few months, we have engaged people who have come downtown for court appearances from adoption hearings to criminal matters. Sometimes college students or dog walkers stop by. Persons who are homeless have also been blessed with good coffee and caring conversation. One volunteer bought a pack of socks based on a need of one of our guests so that future guests could get clean socks if needed.

The hope of the coffee and conversation ministry is that we would have an opportunity to get to know people, share the love of Christ, and look for ways to extend relationships in the future.

# Mission trip to Uganda

October 8-16

Missy Ward and Francis Angalla will host a team from First Baptist later this year. The trip will focus on cultural education and ministry with refugees. Cultural education emphasis: You will learn about Ugandan culture by shopping at local markets, learning how to make traditional baskets, and participating in other cultural experiences. Ministry with refugees: You will support various Amani Sasa ministries by encouraging volunteers, introducing recipes from Tennessee, and working with Refuge in Hope. Cost for the trip is \$1,500 (scholarships are available for young adults). This includes airfare, lodging, and transportation. There will be an optional two-day safari at the end of the trip for an additional cost of \$600. Only six spots remaining! Final day to sign-up is June 24th (\$750 deposit due).
