



It has been three years since the downtown churches have led Stations of the Cross on Good Friday. It has been canceled the last two years due to the pandemic. Stations of the Cross begins in Market Square on Friday, April 15th, at 5:30 pm. It is an ecumenical Stations of the Cross that leads the group to seven stations that depict Christ's journey to the cross on Good Friday. The downtown churches work together with each church taking one of the stations to read from scripture and then give an illustration for that point of the journey. The seven stations travel in a short area of downtown around Market Square and takes about 30-40 minutes. Everyone is invited to join us for Stations of the Cross as we focus on the journey of Christ and what He endured on Good Friday.
