The earth shook, the rocks split 52 and the tombs broke open. # When You Put Yourself in God's Hands Luke 23:44-46; Matthew 27:50-54 Pastor Brent McDougal

For the season of Lent, we've been studying Jesus' "seven last words" from the cross. Jesus' passion was revealed when He uttered words such as "Today you will be with me in paradise...," "Father, forgive them, for they don't know what they're doing," and "I thirst."

Today we come to the last of his last words: "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit." With these last words, He's saying, "Dad, I'm letting go. You take care of everything. I'm in your hands." He points us to the Father and He puts everything in God's hands.

Our problem: we have a hard time letting go. Jesus did it and modeled the way for us, too. But in situations both large and small, we find this incredibly difficult. Why?

Here are the top ten reasons we struggle to let go (according to Peter Scazzero, founder of the Emotionally Healthy Discipleship ministry):

Fear
We worry that things will fall apart
We worry that we will fall apart
Our families of origin
Past betrayals
A distorted image of God
Lack of stillness and silence
Perfectionism
A limited view of letting go
Denial

1. Bring your
spirit.
"Open my lips, Lord, and my mouth will declare your praise. You do not delight in sacrifice, or I would bring it; you do not take pleasure in burnt offerings. My sacrifice, O God, is a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart you, God, will not despise" (Psalm 51:15-17, NIV).
2. Ask God to give you a and
spirit.
"Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me. Do not cast me from your presence or take your Holy Spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of your salvation and grant me a willing spirit, to sustain me" (Psalm 51:10-12, NIV).
3. Practice your spirit every moment, every hour, of every day.

Watch Leonardo DaVinci's iconic painting of The Last Supper come to life as the FBC Drama Team helps us imagine the disciples response when Jesus said "One of you will betray me."
