Building Better Relationships With Difficult People Matthew 5: 43-48 Pastor Brent McDougal

One of the greatest challenges today's graduates will face is the struggle to get along with difficult people. What does Jesus teach about loving our enemies and dealing with people who would seek to treat us unkindly or even do us harm?

> "God showed his great love for us by sending Christ to die for us while we were still sinners" (Romans 5:8, NLT).

"Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only the one who does the will of my Father who is in heaven" (Matthew 7:21, NIV).

If Jesus is truly Lord, then we need to hear clearly His words and be willing to obey them.

Three questions for reflection:

Will you shift your perspective to view your enemy as your _____?

"Do not seek revenge or bear a grudge against anyone among your people, but love your neighbor as yourself.

I am the LORD" (Leviticus 19:18, NIV).

Will you be all-embracing in your

all?
