Building a Better Relationship with God Romans 5:10-11 Pastor Brent McDougal

We've been focusing for the last few weeks on how to have better relationships - better friendships, better relationships with family members, even better relationships with difficult people.	"I want to know Christ—yes, to know the power of his resurrection and participation in his sufferings, becoming like him in his death, and so, somehow, attaining to the resurrection from the dead" (Ephesians 3:10-11, NIV).
But sometimes you can lose your focus on the one relationship that matters the most: your relationship with God.	
	2. Be every day
What can you do if you have lost your focus on God?	before God.
"If you return to me, I will restore you so you can continue to serve me. If you speak words that are worthy, you will be my spokesman. You are to influence them; do not let them influence you!" "When you come before God, don't turn it into a theatrical production Just find a quiet, secluded place so you won't be tempted to role-play before God. Just be there as simply and honestly as you can manage. The focus will shift from you to God, and you will begin to sense his grace" (Matthew 6:5-6, MSG).
