#### **Concert Series Shortfall**

The second half of the series is equally exciting. March will feature a personal friend, Miriam Wallace. We conclude this season with the Pellissippi State Sacred Music Concert in April. This series has been funded by donors within our congregation so that we might offer it as a gift to our community. This year we still need about \$15,000 to finish funding this fabulous series.
