REDEMPTION...A Journey through Matthew's Gospel

Read Matthew 11 & 12. This week's message is entitled, "**For Whom Do the Rules Matter Most,**" and emerges from Matthew 12:1-8. This is the kind of passage that rarely finds its way into pulpits. It is the story of when the disciples find themselves hungry on the Sabbath and that they plucked heads of grains of wheat to eat. The Pharisees respond in condemnation reminding Jesus of the religious rules that were supposed to govern everyone. The core question that rises is, "for whom do rules matter most?" Jesus will teach that God desires more than rule followers - God desires mercy not sacrifice.
